Rohingya/Rohingya language has been officially recognized and registered by ISO, International Organization for Standardization, as being one of the world unique languages. This official announcement has been done by SIL.ORG on its website (http://www.sil.org/iso639-3/documentation.asp?id=rhg) which says effective from July 18, 2007 Rohingya/Rohingya Language has been approved as an active individual living language and hence assigned a unique identifier ISO-639-3 "RHG" as being among the recognized Languages of the world. SIL.ORG is the official site of the ISO 639-3 Registration Authority and thus is the only one authorized by ISO as stated in their website (http://www.sil.org/iso639-3/default.asp).
